Our "Organ Committee" has finished their charter (it took 12 years!) which the Vestry approved (details will be announced soon). The project will take about 14 months (and you won't believe the difference!).

We will have a Community Thanksgiving service on November 23rd beginning at 7:00 pm; each year the location of the service rotates among participating churches, and this year Trinity Presbyterian Church will host the service and I will be the preacher. Non-perishable food and monetary offerings during the service will go to LINK, our

community food bank. St. Timothy's also has a Thanksgiving Eucharist on Thanksgiving Day at 11:00 am.

November 23rd is Christ the King Sunday - the last day of the Church year. The following week, the last week in November, we begin the season of Advent, a season of expectation during which we look for Christ to come again.

We also have the usual things going on, including our Holiday Bazaar November 2, commissioning our Haiti Mission Team for their November trip, and preparations and rehearsals for Christmas celebrations. Bishop Gulick will Receive and Confirm new members at our 11:00 AM service on December 14th. And don't get me started on January; it's one of our busiest months of the year!

Come be part of the life of the church. Meanwhile, I think I need a nap. +


Welcome, New Registered Members
