Information for Our First Time Guests



All children are welcome to stay with parents in the Sanctuary during worship. However, for parents of children ages 0-3 years who want nursery care, we have a well-equipped and professionally-staffed nursery at the end of the hall nearest the Sanctuary. Each child brought to the nursery is given a number; only the parents of the child can take the child from the nursery. If a parent is needed during worship, the child's number will appear (in

red LED's) on the black panels beneath the hymn boards on both sides of the Chancel. Parents, please bring diapers, any snacks, and formula as needed for your child.



All baptized Christians are welcome to receive the Sacrament. If you have not been baptized, please come to the Altar rail for a blessing during Holy Communion (place your arms across your chest to signify your desire for a blessing). If you would like to be baptized, please speak with the clergy after the service. To receive Holy Communion, accept the bread in your hand and place it in your mouth, then sip wine from the Chalice when it is brought to you (guide the Chalice to your mouth please), or hold the bread,

dip it in the wine when the chalice comes to you, and place the bread with wine in your mouth. If you are allergic to wheat or are gluten intolerant, please let the person serving bread know to give you a rice wafer.

Word of God

At the tolling of the bell, all stand.

The Opening Acclamation (BCP 323)

Celebrant Blessed be God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

People And blessed be his kingdom, now and forever. Amen.

The Collect for Purity (BCP 323)

Almighty God, unto whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hid: Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of thy Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love thee, and worthily magnify thy holy Name; through Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

Summary of the Law (BCP 324)

The Lessons

1 Samuel 3:1-10(11-20)

Now the boy Samuel was ministering to the Lord under Eli. The word of the Lord was rare in those days; visions were not widespread.

At that time Eli, whose eyesight had begun to grow dim so that he could not see, was lying down in his room; the lamp of God had not yet gone out, and Samuel was lying down in the temple of the Lord, where the ark of God was. Then the Lord called, "Samuel! Samuel!" and he said, "Here I am!" and ran to Eli, and said, "Here I am, for you called me." But he said, "I did not call; lie down again." So he went and lay down. The Lord called again, "Samuel!" Samuel got up and went to Eli, and said, "Here I am, for you called me." But he said, "I did not call, my son; lie down again." Now Samuel did not yet know the Lord, and the word of the Lord had not yet been revealed to him. The Lord called Samuel again, a third time. And he got up and went to Eli, and said, "Here I am, for you called me." Then Eli perceived that the Lord was calling the boy. Therefore Eli said to Samuel, "Go, lie down; and if he calls you, you shall say, 'Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening." So Samuel went and lay down in his place.

Now the Lord came and stood there, calling as before, "Samuel! Samuel!" And Samuel said, "Speak, for your servant is listening." [Then the Lord said to Samuel, "See, I am about to do something in Israel that will make both ears of anyone who hears of it tingle. On that day I will fulfill against Eli all that I have spoken concerning his house, from beginning to end. For I have told him that I am about to punish his house forever, for the iniquity that he knew, because his sons were blaspheming God, and he did not restrain them. Therefore I swear to the house of Eli that the iniquity of Eli's house shall not be expiated by sacrifice or offering forever."

Samuel lay there until morning; then he opened the doors of the house of the Lord. Samuel was afraid to tell the vision to Eli. But Eli called Samuel and said, "Samuel, my son." He said, "Here I am." Eli said, "What was it that he told you? Do not hide it from me. May God do so to you and more also, if you hide anything from me of all that he told you." So Samuel told him everything and hid nothing from him. Then he said, "It is the Lord; let him do what seems good to him."

As Samuel grew up, the Lord was with him and let none of his words fall to the ground. And all Israel from Dan to Beer-sheba knew that Samuel was a trustworthy prophet of the Lord.

A Reading from 2 Corinthians 4:5-12

We do not proclaim ourselves; we proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord and ourselves as your slaves for Jesus' sake. For it is the God who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

But we have this treasure in clay jars, so that it may be made clear that this extraordinary power belongs to God and does not come from us. We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be made visible in our bodies. For while we live, we are always being given up to death for Jesus' sake, so that the life of Jesus may be made visible in our mortal flesh. So death is at work in us, but life in you.

Reader: The Word of the Lord. **People:** Thanks be to God.

Holy Gospel; Mark 2:23-3:6

Celebrant: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark.

People: Glory be to thee, O Lord.

One sabbath Jesus and his disciples were going through the grainfields; and as they made their way his disciples began to pluck heads of grain. The Pharisees said to him, "Look, why are they doing what is not lawful on the sabbath?" And he said to them, "Have you never read what David did when he and his companions were hungry and in need of food? He entered the house of God, when Abiathar was high priest, and ate the bread of the Presence, which it is not lawful for any but the

priests to eat, and he gave some to his companions." Then he said to them, "The sabbath was made for humankind, and not humankind for the sabbath; so the Son of Man is lord even of the sabbath." Again he entered the synagogue, and a man was there who had a withered hand. They watched him to see whether he would cure him on the sabbath, so that they might accuse him. And he said to the man who had the withered hand, "Come forward." Then he said to them, "Is it lawful to do good or to do harm on the sabbath, to save life or to kill?" But they were silent. He looked around at them with anger; he was grieved at their hardness of heart and said to the man, "Stretch out your hand." He stretched it out, and his hand was restored. The Pharisees went out and immediately conspired with the Herodians against him, how to destroy him.

Sermon

And we earnestly desire thy fatherly goodness to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, whereby we offer and present unto thee, O Lord, our selves, our souls and bodies.

Grant, we beseech thee, that all who partake of this Holy Communion may worthily receive the most precious Body and Blood of thy Son Jesus Christ, and be filled with thy grace and heavenly benediction; and also that we and all thy whole Church may be made one body with him, that he may dwell in us, and we in him; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord; By whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Ghost all honor and glory be unto thee, O Father Almighty, world without end. *Amen.*

All: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. TROOP 159'S DAY AT THE PARK

If you went to Frying Pan Farm Park for their Spring Farm Day on May 12, you might have seen Troop 159 present at one of the tables there! Our table was about invasive plants, which are a pressing environmental issue in Fairfax County. Through the entire event, we got 186 visitors-and it's surprising that many of them didn't know the extent of this problem. Foreign plants and animals that invade native forests may seem like a foreign concept as well, but these invaders can actually be found in your own backyard! While we had plenty of activities and handouts for the kids (sticker and word searches galore!) we were also able to spread the word about the invasive plant cleanups happening at the park in August under the IMA program.

The Invasive Management Area Program (IMA) is a volunteer program under the Fairfax County Park Authority that battles invasive plants by removing them and replacing them with native species. The current project, "START at Frying Pan Farm Park," will remove Japanese stiltgrass, an invasive species that has spread across much of the East Coast and is present in every county within Virginia; if you're wondering about the name, this is because our other goal is to START a habit of environmental stewardship within our local community. This focus on long-term conservation is also part of this project's status as a Hornaday project- the Hornaday Award is a prestigious Scouting award based around substantial effort and contribution to the environment.

Our planned cleanups for August aren't as simple as pulling weeds, however; there's only a short window of time to pull these plants (about two to three weeks,) and we have the weather to contend with as well- in fact, the exact dates will very likely be unclear until July. Bach and studied in Paris with Jean Baptiste Lully. He served in various church positions in France and later Austria. He also studied Law and eventually settled in Vienna. He was the father of Gottlieb Muffat, also a composer and keyboard player. Georg Muffat is best known for his orchestral compositions and accompanying treatises on string instrument playing. The Passacaglia in G Minor is an extended work with a repeating bass figure. Many Baroque composers, including J.S. Bach, wrote in the Passacaglia form. Plan now to come to church a few minutes early on June 10th to hear this special performance on our restored organ!

ENSURING SAINT TIMOTHY'S WILL BE AROUND FOR ANOTHER 150 YEARS

Saint Timothy's has not adequately funded the Capital Assets Reserve Fund and consequently, the Reserve Fund, which is used to pay for capital repairs and replacements, is in trouble. The Fund currently contains approximately \$63,000.00, having recently signed a \$21,000.00 contract to replace the HVAC system which services the music room and nursery. By way of example, the music room and nursery went without air conditioning or heat for nearly a year, due in part because it was feared it would leave the Reserve Fund without adequate resources to pay for some potentially pressing capital needs. At the moment, a major concern is the condition of the remaining 5 HVAC systems which heat and cool St. Timothy's. These systems are out of date and will most likely have to be replaced, sooner rather than later, because the systems require use of the refrigerant freon, whose manufacture and importation have been prohibited by law effective January 1, 2020. Another pressing capital repair involves the condition of Henry Hall. It needs both a paint job and a new floor. Additionally, the roof needs new shingles. Lastly, what about those repairs that are likely to come which we cannot foresee? What comes immediately to mind are those repairs involving plumbing. Clearly, the amount currently in the Reserve Fund is woefully inadequate to pay for these repairs. Simply put, St. Tim's needs to find a mechanism very soon to fund its Reserve Fund or run the real risk of having the building where we worship and minister to the community fall into a state of disrepair.

St. Timothy's Episcopal Church was founded on November 1, 1868, and is a member Region V of the Diocese of Virginia, one of the Episcopal Church's 9 original dioceses and the largest diocese in the domestic U.S. The bell from our 1881 church building has been electrified and continues to ring before every Sunday service and major holy day. Our 1870 James D. Moore Tracker pipe organ was restored and reinstalled April, 2017.

We have a long history of outreach within and beyond the Herndon/Reston community. We staff The Closet, which had its beginnings at St. Timothy's in the 1970s. The first homeless shelter in Fairfax County began in our Henry Hall in 1984 and became the Embry Rucker Shelter, which we continue to staff. We run a school supply drive and holiday Angel Tree in addition to supporting LINK, Helping Hungry Kids, and Cornerstones, among others. We serve the poorest in our state, our nation, and our hemisphere with yearly mission trips to Dungannon, VA, Pine Ridge Indian Reservation, SD, and Chapoteau, Haiti.
