I know a person in Christ who fourteen years ago was caught up to the third heaven—whether in the body or out of the body I do not know; God knows. And I know that such a person—whether in the body or out of the body I do not know; God knows— was caught up into Paradise and heard things that are not to be told, that no mortal is permitted to repeat. On behalf of such a one I will boast, but on my own behalf I will not boast, except of my weaknesses. But if I wish to boast, I will not be a fool, for I will be speaking the truth. But I refrain from it, so that no one may think better of me than what is seen in me or heard from me, even considering the exceptional character of the revelations. Therefore, to keep me from being too elated, a thorn was given me in the flesh, a messenger of Satan to torment me, to keep me from being too elated. Three times I appealed to the Lord about this, that it would leave me, but he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." So, I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may dwell in me. Therefore I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities for the sake of Christ; for whenever I am weak, then I am strong.



The Vestry met on June 19th. After prayer and sharing stories of God's grace, Kent Miller and John Nixon presented a report from the Stewardship Committee. They requested a vision budget from the Vestry, so the committee can plan the fall Stewardship Campaign. Andy Hamm reported that a portable dehumidifier has been installed in the sanctuary and the Vestry approved the completion of the music area, including bolting choir pews and purchasing flexible seating to complement the fixed seating in the music area. Father Rich reported that St. Timothy's will be sharing space with a small church, starting in July. Holy Trinity has approximately 20 members and will be using the sanctuary and narthex every Sunday after the 10:00 service. The Vestry approved a capital campaign to run concurrently with the 150th Anniversary Celebration later this year. An outline of the campaign will be discussed at the July Vestry meeting. CREATING A SUSTAINABLE CHURCH – The Endowment Fund Ensuring Saint Timothy's will be around for the next 150 years

The third and final piece of our stewardship initiative is THE ENDOWMENT FUND. To review, the General Fund pays for outreach programs and operating expenses while the Reserve Fund pays for the repair and replacement of large capital assets. The Endowment Fund benefits the parish wherever the need is the greatest. An endowment is broadly defined as a permanent gift of money or property to an institution for a particular purpose. Church endowment funds are generally permanent funds whose investment income is made available for ministries, outreach, care of the facility or reinvestment. St. Timothy's Fund is typical of most church endowment funds because "only" the investment proceeds are used to benefit the parish. The principal of the endowment cannot be distributed. For example, the endowment committee this past year, with vestry approval, decided to reinvest the \$4,000 earned rather than contribute to either the General or Reserve Funds. At St. Timothy's, an endowment gift can be made at any time or on a regularly scheduled basis as part of a member's estate plan. The Endowment Fund at St. Timothy's currently contains about \$100,000 and is held and administered for St. Tim's by the Diocese of Virginia. On average, many parishes have \$500,000 invested with the Diocese. Some parishes have more and some like St. Timothy's have much less. If only St. Timothy's had \$500,000 in its Endowment Fund, it could have put a total of \$20,000 toward our most pressing need which is currently deficit reduction. In sum, a donor to the Endowment Fund has the assurance that their gift will be a stable source of income and a "lasting" contribution by them to the ministry and mission of St. Timothy's for generations to come. Next month we will examine how members can assist in growing the Endowment Fund, helping make St. Timothy's sustainable well into the future. Deke Smith, Endowment Committee

"Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?"

Images of children ripped from the arms of their parents at the borders and of crying toddlers in detention centers have ripped our hearts wide open. From the depths of broken-hearted compassion we, along with Episcopalians across the nation, cry out for justice, respect and dignity for men, women and children who have fled life-threatening violence in their homelands and seek asylum in the United States. We, along with people on all sides of political divides, people from a wide variety of faiths and people who proclaim no faith at all, say no to the separation of families.

At noon on Sunday, July 8, we Bishops and some General Convention Deputies from the Diocese of Virginia will participate in a prayer service outside of the T. Don Hutto Residential Detention Center in Taylor, Texas. We will pray for an end to the inhumane treatment of asylum seekers and for the loving, liberating, live-giving presence of Christ to be revealed, more fully than ever, within and among us. (The detention center is operated for Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) by a private prison company and is about 40 miles from the Austin Convention Center where General Convention will be held.)

We do this because the Church can never afford to overlook our responsibility to be a witness to the Gospel in the midst of the ongoing debates in our culture, especially when they involve profoundly moral questions and values. People everywhere, even the unchurched, look to the Church for hope and guidance in times like these. We are called to give voice to that hope and guidance.

We take sides in this matter because Jesus himself took sides with vulnerable children. Jesus honored children and blessed them at a time when they were expected to be neither seen nor heard. In his name, we must open eyes and hearts to see these detained children and act in ways that will bring blessings upon them. By taking time during General Convention and going to pray outside of a detention center, we respond to the last question in our Baptismal Covenant with a resounding, "We will, with God's help." Christians should respond to every opportunity to live our faith in words and action not only at home or at church, but especially in the public square. So we invite you to join us in prayer and other action for the sake of vulnerable children and families. St. Timothy's Episcopal, founded on November 1, 1868, is a member of Region V of the Diocese of Virginia, one of the Episcopal Church's 9 original dioceses and the largest diocese in the domestic U.S. The bell from our 1881 church building has been electrified and continues to ring before every Sunday service and major holy day. Our 1870 James D. Moore Tracker pipe organ was restored and reinstalled April 2017.

We have a long history of outreach within and beyond the Herndon/Reston community. We staff The Closet, which had its beginnings at St. Timothy's in the 1970s. The first homeless shelter in Fairfax County began in our Henry Hall in 1984 and became the Embry Rucker Shelter, which we continue to staff. We run a school supply drive and holiday Angel Tree in addition to supporting LINK, Helping Hungry Kids,

and Cornerstones, among others. We serve the poorest in our state, our nation, and our hemisphere with yearly mission trips to Dungannon, VA, Pine Ridge Indian Reservation, SD, and Chapoteau, Haiti.

We worship 4 times per week, in English and in Spanish, and we welcome everyone who would like to worship with us and become a part of our community. If you are visiting us, please sign the guest book in the Narthex and introduce yourself to our clergy and vestry members.

Information for Our First Time Guests



All children are welcome to stay with parents in the Sanctuary during worship. However, for parents of children ages 0-3 years who want nursery care, we have a well-equipped and professionally-staffed nursery at the end of the hall nearest the Sanctuary. Each child brought to the nursery is given a number; only the parents of the child can take the child from the nursery. If a parent is needed during worship, the child's number will appear (in

red LED's) on the black panels beneath the hymn boards on both sides of the Chancel. Parents, please bring diapers, any snacks, and formula as needed for your child.



All baptized Christians are welcome to receive the Sacrament. If you have not been baptized, please come to the Altar rail for a blessing during Holy Communion (place your arms across your chest to signify your desire for a blessing). If you would like to be baptized, please speak with the clergy after the service. To receive Holy Communion, accept the bread in your hand and place it in your mouth, then sip wine from the Chalice when it is brought to you (guide the Chalice to your mouth please), or hold the bread,

dip it in the wine when the chalice comes to you, and place the bread with wine in your mouth. If you are allergic to wheat or are gluten intolerant, please let the person serving bread know to give you a rice wafer.
