


Dear Friends,

Instead of my usual letter I want to draw your attention to the Stewardship Letter. Because of the pandemic we are changing the way we do our Annual Stewardship Campaign. This year it will be about half the length as usual and we will not be doing the interactive piece like we did last year. I want to be transparent and up front: 2021 is going to be much more difficult financially for Saint Timothy's than last year. The reason for this is twofold. First, we do not have the same revenue streams that we have had every year in the past. Our groups have not been meeting in our space, which means they are not able to contribute to our upkeep, and the church we have renting from us is not meeting and so we do not have the income they usually provide. Second, we will not receive a \$50,000 Payroll Protection Plan grant like we did in 2020. The bottom line is we may be down as much as \$80,000 to \$100,000 in revenue this next year.

Please enter into a time of prayer to discern what you are able to give this year. If you can raise your pledge that would be great. If you can meet last year's pledge and then give a onetime gift to help us get through 2021, I would greatly appreciate it. Please know that I will be sending out a special Stewardship letter the first week in October with a pledge card. If it does not reach you by the 15th of October, please contact the office and we will send you another.



Please fill it out immediately and send it back and consider increasing your pledge over last year. Our theme this year is *One Together*. If we all pull together, we can get through this difficult year and return to some sense of normalcy. That is my prayer.

Gifts for Kids Drive – This is also known as the Angel Tree at St. Timothy's and will be with gift cards only this year. Due to the pandemic, picking names and purchasing, then turning in gifts would be complicated. Instead Service Ministry will ask for donations to the Service Fund and we will purchase and deliver the requested gift

cards. We have committed St. Timothy's to support 35 children. Gift cards will be due to Cornerstones in mid-November, so stay tuned to the eNews for specific instructions regarding this opportunity.

LINK

Stuff-a-Truck – Typically, Service Ministry hosts a Stuff-a-Truck food drive on church grounds in September. This year there will be a modified version on October 11 during the morning worship periods. A Drive-Thru Food Drive will be held in the parking lot opposite the preschool entrance. Volunteers will help unload donations directly to the collection vehicles. No need to get out of your car if you prefer to stay distant! A shopping list will be provided in upcoming eNews announcements. The list this year will be customized to accommodate the unique needs of this years' LINK holiday food distribution.

Holiday Food Program – LINK will provide prepacked groceries for up to 1500 families during the holiday season this year. The Holiday Food Distribution will occur on three dates in November and December rather than the two November and December distributions. Clients will be required to register online rather than in person and will be assigned a date to pick up their food and gift cards. All food will be packed by family size in advance and clients will drive through the distribution queue to pick up their groceries. Clients will remain in their cars. Volunteers will check them in and load the food into their car. Food distribution will be held only at Christ the Redeemer Catholic Church in Sterling. Since it's not possible to hold the coat and toy distributions, LINK is partnering with The Closet to provide coupons for clients to obtain warm clothing and toys. There will be a huge need for volunteers to help with sorting and packing donated food. Please watch the eNews for signup details to volunteer.

<u>Donations</u> – Donation hours have changed due to the large amount of donations.

Donation hours are now: 8 am - noon

Monday through Saturday. Changeover to Fall/Winter is in place.

Shopping – Shopping hours are 10 am – 8 pm Monday and Thursday, 10 am – 5 pm Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday. There are Senior Shopping hours on Thursday morning from 8:30 am – 10 am. When you shop, your temperature will be taken, you will need to wear a mask and you should not shop if you are not feeling good.
