


Dear Friends,

As we approach Thanksgiving and the holiday season, many of us are feeling unsure of what lies ahead. The future is not certain and many of us will not be able to enjoy the many traditions we have come to love at this time of year. Because this year will be different, I want to encourage everyone to be intentional about the practice of Gratitude. Being grateful is a spiritual practice the gives our souls strength and enables us to see light in the darkness. I cannot explain why it works, but I can say that when I take time each day to make a list of things for which I am grateful, I am stronger emotionally and able to live in the light.

I want to suggest that for the month of November we all engage in a Gratitude practice. The one that I find most effective is making a list of ten items each day for which I am grateful. One of the rules I follow is that I can't repeat items on the list for three days. That helps me dig deeper into what is important in my life. I have found that being grateful for what I have in my life, gives me energy and connection to God's world. As the Apostle Paul said, "In all things, give thanks." Paul faced death, shipwrecks and a variety of difficult circumstances and yet, he was able to carry Christ's message of salvation to the Gentiles. He was able to be joyful.

As an opportunity for us to be grateful, we are working on a Thanksgiving service that will be online on the day of Thanksgiving. It will premiere at a certain time, but you will be able to watch it at



your convenience. The service will include music and a reflection on Gratitude. I encourage you to adopt an intentional practice of gratitude beginning on the first of November and continuing until the day of Thanksgiving. Let's offer up the entire month of November as an offering to God by being Grateful.

When Elie Wiesel accepted the Nobel Peace Prize he said, "No one is as capable of gratitude as one who has emerged from the kingdom of night. We know that every moment is a moment of grace, every hour an offering; not to share them would mean to betray them. Our lives no longer belong to us alone; they belong to those who need us desperately."

Those who have struggled, who have known suffering are often the most grateful people I know because they consider each moment a gift. When we understand that each moment in our lives is a gift, our lives become gifts, gifts that we want to share. A gratitude practice is not just about feeling good or having energy. More than anything it is about receiving a gift. The gift of life.

Shawl Ministry News

Several months ago, I called Pastor Dan Johnson, Pine Ridge Retreat Center, and asked him if the Lakota needed hats, scarves or sweaters. He replied that the Lakota really needed blankets, which now have been provided. On Wednesday, September 30th, a box was posted to the Pine Ridge Retreat Center, Pine Ridge, South Dakota. The box contained nine blankets, four hats, seven headbands and eight scarves. The hats, headbands and scarves were what remained in the Shawl Ministry storage bins.

The Shawl Ministry is now seeking places to donate supplies of lap robes, shawls and baby blankets. The organizations to which items are usually donated are not accepting things because of the pandemic. We still will keep a supply of baby blankets, shawls and lap robes for St. Timothy's.




