A Reading from Hebrews 12:18-29

You have not come to something that can be touched, a blazing fire, and darkness, and gloom, and a tempest, and the sound of a trumpet, and a voice whose words made the hearers beg that not another word be spoken to them. (For they could not endure the order that was given, "If even an animal touches the mountain, it shall be stoned to death." Indeed, so terrifying was the sight that Moses said, "I tremble with fear.") But you have come to Mount Zion and to the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and to innumerable angels in festal gathering, and to the assembly of the firstborn who are enrolled in heaven, and to God the judge of all, and to the spirits of the righteous made perfect, and to Jesus, the mediator of a new covenant, and to the sprinkled blood that speaks a better word than the blood of Abel.

See that you do not refuse the one who is speaking; for if they did not escape when they refused the one who warned them on earth, how much less will we escape if we reject the one who warns from heaven! At that time his voice shook the earth; but now he has promised, "Yet once more I will shake not only the earth but also the heaven." This phrase, "Yet once more," indicates the removal of what is shaken-- that is, created things-- so that what cannot be shaken may remain. Therefore, since we are receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, let us give thanks, by which we offer to God an acceptable worship with reverence and awe; for indeed our God is a consuming fire

"HOPE for HAITI" AGAPE - August 21, August 28, September 3

Since 2010 St. Timothy's has been sending children to school in Haiti. Because of your generosity, our support has grown from the original goal of sending six children to school for six years to supporting an entire school. St. Mathieu's Episcopal School, located in the rural village of Chapoteau, has no electricity and running water, yet every year over 200 children attend daily where they are taught and nurtured by a dozen teachers.

Over three Sundays, August 21 through September 3rd, the Haiti Ministry and the Service Ministry will bring you up to date on the status of the school, the political situation in Haiti, share words from the Priest-in-Charge for the area, and ask for your financial support in continuing this critical mission. Next Sunday, On August 28th, we will welcome The Reverend Roger Bowen, who has a long history of involvement with Episcopal schools in Haiti, as our guest preacher. Also on August 28th, we will have a Coffee Hour to hear more from the Haiti Team, to get a chance to meet our guest preacher, and to give!
