Dear Parish Family,

Dear St. Timothy's Family,

50 years ago, former Vice President Spiro T. Agnew (baptized an Episcopalian!) coined the phrase "Nattering Nabobs of Negativity." He meant it to describe the tendency of the press to offer relentless criticism towards an institution or individual.

I think about that wonderfully alliterative phrase every time a new study is published about church decline. Those reports are always such an overwhelmingly negative portrait that the whole religious exercise seems to be put into question.



Meanwhile, the Episcopal Church seems to almost specialize in that sort of data collection and distribution. If nothing else, we as a denomination tend to have accurate figures on what is happening in the pews and in the church coffers.

With all that mind, around the time that Agnew uttered his phrase, my predecessor and friend, the Reverend Ralph Bayfield, issued the following goals for St. Timothy's in the upcoming year:

GOALS FOR PARISH 1976

PREAMBLE: With such a diversity of people of all ages from many areas, backgrounds, and heritages, a multi-faceted ministry by laity and clergy is needed to 1) develop a closer relationship to God through Jesus Christ, 2) enable people to meet the challenges and demands of life with the Christian faith and 3) to enrich and free people to lead fuller and more meaningful lives.

It included the following statistical goal for church growth:

This can be better accomplished by:

1. Growth of the Gospel - A greater sharing of the good news of Christ as expressed in the warm, friendly feeling of St. Timothy's Church with a greater number of people in our community, Diocese and abroad. Locally attract more people to attend St. Timothy's Church on a regular basis. A goal of 100 additional members to fill our Church to capacity by the end of 1976.

Ralph also called for more than \$150,000 (in today's dollars) in additional giving. (Oh, to be in Parish Ministry in the 20th century!) I was struck by the amount... as 100 new members seems astounding even by 1976 standards. But I also noted the overall positive tone; the report was consistently optimistic, forward-thinking, and relentlessly focused on God's mission.

Of course, it is not 1976, nor will it be so again. The mission field is constantly changing and evolving. That having been said, during this month of January, your vestry and I are excited about announcing the statistical results of the 2023 Stewardship Campaign. "St. Timothy's is (indeed) back!" We also look forward to our Annual Meeting on January 22nd as we elect new vestry and officers for the upcoming year, hear from all of our ministry leaders and their reports, and pass a budget that will guide and shape us living out God's mission here in Herndon.

In the meantime, know that our numbers are generally up. Members have been generous with their gifts to the church and people are finding their way into this community of faith. It makes me excited and serves as a counter-narrative to all the "nattering nabobs of negativity."

Church growth can be its own false god, but statistics and numbers do tell an important part of the story about making disciples. Again, I look forward to sharing those numbers with you in the weeks ahead as we write the next chapter in St. Timothy's story!

Report from the Vestry

Dear Friends,

The Vestry met on Tuesday December 20, 2022 at 7:00 pm at the church. Charles Cowherd, Priest-in-Charge, presided and gave the opening prayer. Kathy Lombard, Treasurer, also participated.

Kathy gave the Treasurer's report for November. Income for the church was at 96% of the budgeted amount for the month. Good news is that St. Timothy's is projected to have a substantial overage for the year.

Carolyn Hamm proposed year end financial adjustments which included reimbursements to Fr. Franklin for his mileage and staff bonuses.

Charles presented the 2023 Vision Budget for review. Adjustments were discussed and agreed on including a COLA increase for all staff at St. Timothy's. David Dopsovic will pursue a 15 month, 4% CD at Main Street Bank when our current CD expires in January.

St. Timothy's will be voting in 3 new people to the vestry in January. Everyone on the vestry was encouraged to talk to people about running for vestry.

Charles reported that the budget for 2023 will be based on income of \$492K. This includes pledges and a number of people who give regularly but do not pledge. The Annual Parish Meeting will be Sunday, January 22. Beginning in January, the Vestry will move its meetings to the 4th Tuesday of each month.

Maria reported that the Northern Fairfax Region provided \$3000 to support the Latino Ministry. We should be receiving the check by the end of December.

The meeting concluded at 9:20 pm.


