



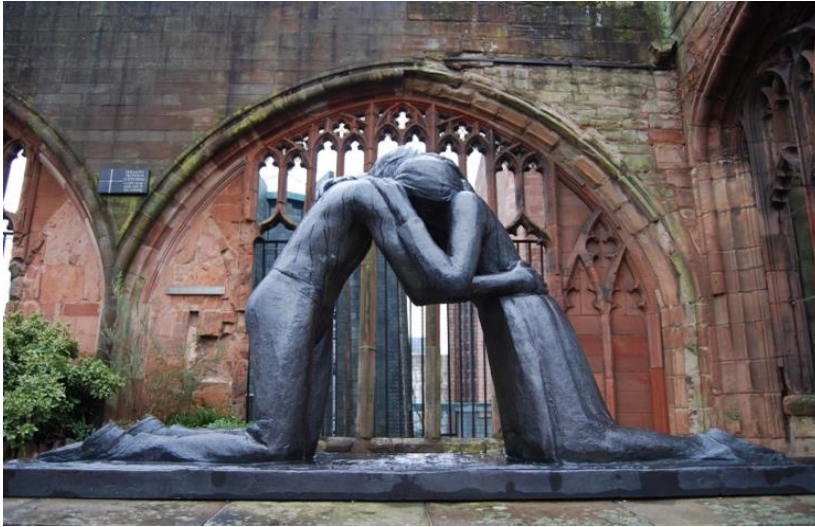

Jesus said, "You have heard that it was said to those of ancient times, 'You shall not murder'; and 'whoever murders shall be liable to judgment.' But I say to you that if you are angry with a brother or sister, you will be liable to judgment; and if you insult a brother or sister, you will be liable to the council; and if you say, 'You fool,' you will be liable to the hell of fire. So when you are offering your gift at the altar, if you remember that your brother or sister has something against you, leave your gift there before the altar and go; first be reconciled to your brother or sister, and then come and offer your gift. "It was also said, 'Whoever divorces his wife, let him give her a certificate of divorce.' But I say to you that anyone who divorces his wife,

except on the ground of unchastity, causes her to commit adultery; and whoever marries a divorced woman commits adultery. “Again, you have heard that it was said to those of ancient times, ‘You shall not swear falsely, but carry out the vows you have made to the Lord.’ But I say to you, Do not swear at all, either by heaven, for it is the throne of God, or by the earth, for it is his footstool, or by Jerusalem, for it is the city of the great King. In honor of Black History Month, St. Timothy's Community Engagment would like to highlight Dan Smith, a heroic person of color.

Dan Smith may have been the last known living person born to a formerly enslaved parent. He was born in 1932 to former enslaved person, Abram (A.B.) Smith, of Massies Mill, Virginia. (Dan Smith at Virginia's Camp Pickett during Army basic training in 1952. (Family photo). Growing up, young Daniel's father, Abram instilled excellence in his children. They were pressed to be, and known to be – always the hardest working children, the most polite. Dan in retrospect, “can now see his parents as followers of the “twice as good” philosophy — the futile belief that black people must perform twice as well as whites just to be considered equal. And beneath the sunny message of how extraordinary the Smith children were, lay Abram Smith's stories of slavery with their frightening symbols of brutality.”(Sydney Trent, WaPo article, 2020).



A very short select list of his truly NUMEROUS accomplishments are listed here:

Served as a medic in the Korean War. Saved the life of a white young man whose truck flipped over in flood waters in 1955 during Hurricane Diane when the Mad River breached its banks. 87 others perished in the flood that day. Was elected student body president of the largely white Springfield College. Was admitted to Veterinary College. In 1972 started a \$60 million dollar program with NIH, the AEC, aiming to train primary care doctors to work in underserved areas. Ushered U.S. Presidents as head usher at the National Cathedral.

The Rev. Franklin Morales – Latino Service Priest

JOB DESCRIPTION: Franklin serves as the Supply Priest for our Spanish-Speaking members, leading the Saturday night community in worship as well as helping with formation and pastoral care.

BIOGRAPHY: Franklin is a native of Venezuela, and a former Carmelite priest. He spent time in Central America before becoming a Lutheran Pastor; he currently serves as the Associate Pastor at St. Luke's Lutheran Church in Silver Spring, MD. Pastor Franklin, as he prefers to be called, is licensed to celebrate in the Episcopal tradition and in the Diocese of Virginia. He makes his home with his wife and daughter in Silver Spring.

Favorite Bible Verse: *Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!* ~2nd Corinthians 5.17 This verse reminds me that God's design is always unique and never the same, which I found beautiful, the fact that God's grace is constantly renewing us and making us unique, no matter what. It gives me joy and hopes in my daily journey.

Favorite Hymn: *Vamos todos al banquete.* This Spanish hymn invites all people to worship God, regardless of their backgrounds and social status. It is a hymn that seeks justice and righteousness from God.

Fun Fact: Because Father Franklin was raised as a Catholic, he never thought or looked to become a priest. He wanted to have a family and get a regular job. So, when he was invited to a retreat, he realized it was for those who felt God's call to ministry. He talked to the priest in charge and said he was in the wrong place. The priest told him we were never in the wrong place, just at the wrong time. Five years later, he went to seminary and started his studies to become a priest within the Catholic Church.

Todd Grivetti – Organist/Choirmaster

JOB DESCRIPTION: Todd works part-time at St. Tim's and his duties include: choosing the hymns with Charles for Sunday worship, preparing the adult choir for the offertory anthem, and playing a prelude and postlude each Sunday. In addition, Todd prepares special music, instrumentalists, and guest vocalists for festival services throughout the church year. Todd oversees the entire music ministry and looks forward to collaboration with future handbell and children's choirs.
