I invite you all to the services this week as we prepare to experience the Easter miracle.


As a reminder, here's the schedule:



To add to that, we will also celebrate Holy Baptism on Easter Sunday at the 10 am service as we welcome the newest members of St. Timothy's into the Body of Christ. The week following, we will again have another on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in Easter at the 10 am service. Join with me in welcoming those joining our community and in pledging your participation to raising them within this parish family.

On a personal note, April 1st marks one year of myself and my family with you in Herndon as your Priestin-Charge! I noted at the time the irony of that date ("April Fool's Day") twelve months ago. Please know that it has been a wonderful trip around the sun in leadership in your community.

A curiosity of the calendar is that every so often, Easter Day falls on April 1st, April Fool's Day. It last did so in 2018, and will do so again in 2029. I think about St. Paul's statement about the "foolishness of the world" when I think about that juxtaposition. I also recall that, whenever Easter is indeed on April Fool's



Day, that means that Ash Wednesday falls on Valentine's Day! I choose to think that those two calendar dates can be joined, so that we start our Lenten Journey in the dark but in love, and we end in what looks like in great foolishness, but what is, in reality, the victory of the Cross bearing that love for us all!

## **Upcoming Food Drive for LINK**

Many of our neighbors are experiencing food insecurity. Over the years, St. Timothy's, along with other local congregations, has supported LINK to meet the needs of the community. Unfortunately this need has increased over the past several years. In fact, SNAP benefits (formerly known as Food Stamps) were decreased significantly on March 1st. This decrease in benefits has been named a "Hunger Cliff" and many people in Herndon and the surrounding communities have gone over the "Cliff".

The Service Ministry has come up with an approach to offer a more proactive approach for the St. Timothy's congregation to help feed those in need. At all services on April 22nd/23rd, Service Ministry members will be handing out cloth bags with a list of items needed by the LINK food pantry. You will see us in the Narthex after each service handing out bags. Please take one and return it the following week (April 29th/30th) with items for the pantry. Whatever you are able to contribute will be greatly appreciated.

Other area churches that support LINK have implemented this approach and have reported great enthusiasm and an increase in donations for LINK. This is a worthy cause and we are confident that St. Timothy's, as always, will support our neighbors in need.

### Update on Chapoteau, Haiti

Following is a letter from Pr Kesner Gracia, Priest in Charge, in Chapoteau, Haiti with an update from St. Mathieu's. We will be conducting our annual fund raiser for the school in August. Please keep the children, teachers, and families in your prayers, as well as all of the people in Haiti. *Thank you, Carolyn Hamm.* 

Dear Sisters and Brothers, our supporters:

First of all, we greet you in Christ and thank you for your ongoing support. So that you may have a better understanding of how the school is functioning, and the situation in the country, we submit this report for your review:

Regarding the school and all of its activities, everything is going very well. The children come to school every day and a hot meal is served to them every day. The parents are happy. We have 9 teachers, 1 director, 2 watchmen, 2 housewives and 3 cooks. We have a total of 17 workers at the school.

Unfortunately, we have suspended the secondary section of the school due to a lack of financial means to pay the teachers. Since we are forced to close the secondary section, we do not send students to official exams. While the state requires that each school have a secondary section, this has presented a problem for us.

In Haiti, there is a carnival holiday from February 20 - 23. We take this opportunity to offer a training/seminar for teachers and we will send you some photos.

In terms of the country's political situation, things are getting worse every day. Only the intervention of a specialized international force could help us to finish with this wave of generalized insecurity.

Given your love and compassion for the people of Haiti, I thank you again and salute your continued support. Your fervent prayers are as important as the financial help. For all that you have done, on behalf of the entire Chapoteau community, we thank you and we also assure you of our prayers.

May God bless you and bless as well Haiti and America.
