
In the grave they laid him, love whom men had slain,

Celebrant: The Lord be with you. **People:** And also with you.

Celebrant: Lift up your hearts.

People: We lift them to the Lord.

Celebrant: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. **People:** It is right to give God thanks and praise.

Celebrant: It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

CONFIRMATION CLASSES - begins May 7, 2023

In anticipation of our biennial bishop's visit on June 25th, St. Timothy's will be offering Confirmation classes for all those interested in Confirmation, Reception and Reaffirmation in the Episcopal Church. These preparation classes will begin on Sunday, May 7th and continue every **Sunday until Trinity Sunday (June 4th)**. They will take place during the 9 AM hour in between our two services, be led by our Priest-in-Charge, and will also be livestreamed.

→ Who is invited to attend these classes?

All are invited to attend the classes, regardless of your confirmation status! Please come for a refresher, or to help answer questions and provide perspectives. Those seeking confirmation will need to attend most of the sessions.

NOTE:

→ While many consider Confirmation to be a rite exclusively for teens, anyone who has not been confirmed may seek formation for this mature commitment of faith. For more information, see page 412 of the Book of Common Prayer.

→ What is Confirmation?

Confirmation is a sacramental rite in which candidates "express a mature commitment to Christ, and receive strength from the Holy Spirit through prayer and the laying on of hands by a bishop." As such, the rite—just as with Baptism—marks a transition within a lifelong journey of formation in the Christian faith.

→ What is Reception?

Reception is designed for those who have already been Confirmed in another Christian denomination and who wish to be received into the fellowship of The Episcopal Church and the Anglican Communion.

→ What is Reaffirmation?

This rite is designed for those candidates who have returned from a time of religious inactivity or wish to publicly recommit themselves to an active practice of faith.

The Commissioning of Missionaries

Celebrant:

Brothers and Sisters, we are united by one Spirit into one Body, and given a variety of gifts for the building up of the people of God and the Kingdom of God. Today we commission members of our Church community as missionaries to the Pine Ridge Reservation.

The Celebrant asks the missionaries:

Sisters and brothers in Christ, are you prepared by true and living faith, by respect for all of God's people, and by the knowledge of your duties, to execute this ministry to the honor of God, and the well-being of the people of God?

Missionaries I am.

The Celebrant then says:

You have been called to serve God, sharing through word and example the Good News of God's love in Jesus Christ. Will you, as long as you are engaged in this work, perform it with charity, integrity, and faith?

Missionaries I will.

Celebrant: You are my witnesses, says the Lord, and the servants I have chosen. Congregation: Call upon the Lord your God, give thanks, and make God's deeds known among the people.

Celebrant: Let us pray. (Silence)
