This new platform offers reduced transaction fees, will greatly reduce the bookkeeper's time, and offers a better interface with our database system. It will also add some additional features not available on the old platform, such as the ability to add a note for flower donations and giving donors the opportunity to cover the transactions fees.

March 31, 2024 will be the last day a donation to St. Timothy's can be made through Clovergive. As of April 1, our website and scannable bar codes will be updated to reflect the change.
