For I handed on to you as of first importance what I in turn had received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the scriptures, and that he was buried, and that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers and sisters at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have died. Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me. For I am the least of the apostles, unfit to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his

grace towards me has not been in vain. On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them— though it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me. Whether then it was I or they, so we proclaim and so you have come to believe.

We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Sacrament of the Body of Christ and his Blood of the new Covenant. Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we may be acceptable through him, being sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with Timothy and all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation. By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. **AMEN.**

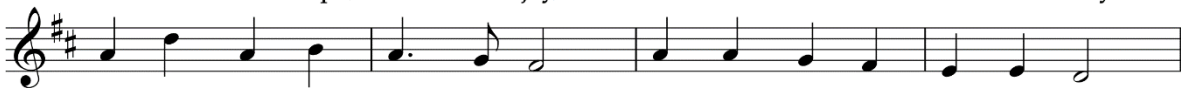

Dear Parish Family and Friends,

Alleluia! Christ is risen! I would like to welcome you on this “Happy Morning” as we celebrate Christ’s glorious resurrection through music, sacrament, and prayer.

Whether you are returning to church after a time away or are new to the faith; whether you are looking for a new church home or simply seeking a place to experience community; we are glad you are here with us at St. Timothy’s.

St. Timothy’s is a warm and welcoming community, offering a variety of fellowship, music, and outreach activities for wherever you are on your spiritual journey. On Sunday mornings, we gather for worship at 8:00 am (Holy Eucharist, spoken) and 10:00 am (Holy Eucharist, with music) while our Spanish-Speaking members gather on Saturdays at 7:00 pm. **If you are**

a guest or visitor today and would like the church to be in touch with you, we invite you to fill out a Welcome Card located in the pew rack or on the podium in the Narthex. Once completed, please drop your Welcome Card into the offertory plate or hand to an usher. We look forward to being in touch with you soon.

Today, children will stay with their parents in the Sanctuary for the churchwide Easter celebration. Following the sermon, they will be invited forward to be able to see better for the baptism. Parents are welcome to stay with them if that is easier. (On most Sundays, there is an opportunity to head downstairs after the reading of the Collect, for Godly Play [ages 3-8] or outside for Sunday School [ages 9-12].) For your convenience, there are also rocking chairs located at the back of the sanctuary to soothe little ones and worship bags with quiet activities in the Narthex.

We invite you to share in Holy Communion. To receive, come forward and kneel/stand at an open space on the altar rail. Both bread (gluten free available on request) and wine (either sip from the chalice or allow the chalice-bearer to intinct) will be offered. If you don't wish to receive, we invite you to come forward for a blessing. Please indicate that by placing your arms across your chest.

All are welcome to join us after the 10 AM service for an Easter Egg Hunt and fellowship on the campus grounds immediately following the service.
