

## Dear St. Timothy's Family,

I am a proud member of the *Historical Society of the Episcopal Church* and receive, as a perk of membership, one of its publications, *The Historiographer*. This quarterly newsletter seeks to promote the preservation of church records and the writing of parochial and diocesan history in the Episcopal Church. A recent article in the December issue of *The Historiographe*, was entitled "Free resource for online columbaria database,"



and it piqued my interest given that St. Timothy's, of course, has a columbarium. The article detailed how the *Find A Grave* (FG) website can be a good resource for churches to create a digital memorial for decedents. That is, although Episcopal Church canons require keeping a *physical* service registry of burials made from a parish, the website is a good way to share that information more widely, while also creating a *digital* backup.

Our columbarium (if you don't remember from last month's WORD!) is located in the half-wall on the Gospel side of the sanctuary and is designated for the interment of the ashes of people who have died and been cremated. It is one of the most special places on our church grounds as it holds the remains of the saints who have gone before us into God's presence. Because of this and, given that FG is crowd-sourced and thus inevitably suffers from inaccuracies, I initially hesitated to share the details of those buried here onto the FG platform. Gradually, however, I decided to seek permissions from the relatives of those buried in the columbarium for their loved ones' information to be included in the FG website.

For me personally, it has been a great gift and blessing to go through, one by one, the list of names that are buried in our columbarium. I relearned stories that I had heard since I began at St. Timothy's, and I discovered for the first time many new stories of those who are buried there. There are stories of intense grief and loss because of life cut short... and the stories of those who died after a long life and service to the church. The columbarium itself, and our *Find A Grace* website by extension, thus tells a remarkable testimony of discipleship and ministry. Please do check out the information on the FG website

(<a href="https://www.findagrave.com/cemetery/2475228/saint-timothy's-episcopal-church-cemetery">https://www.findagrave.com/cemetery/2475228/saint-timothy's-episcopal-church-cemetery</a>) and say a prayer the next time you are walking by that side of the sanctuary for that "great cloud of witnesses" that makes up a part of our history.



# Service Ministry's 2024 Lenten Outreach Project

Each year the Service Ministry sponsors a project where our parishioners can learn about a community need and work to fulfill it. The project usually includes elements of education or awareness raising, and potentially donation of physical items.

We are excited to announce that this year's Lenten Outreach project is to collect lightly used, serviceable musical instruments suitable for middle and high school band and orchestra students. Serviceable means readily playable without repairs. No keyboards/pianos & no recorders please. The instrument will be donated to Park View High School and Sterling Middle School. Both schools are Title I schools which are schools with a high percentage of children from low-income families. No specific instruments were requested, but there is always a need for brass, woodwind, and string instruments. If you have neighbors who have instruments, feel free to include them as well. The goal is to supplement the schools' program such that children who could not afford to rent or purchase an instrument will still have an opportunity to pursue a musical interest. The Lenten outreach project will kick off on February 25<sup>th</sup> and conclude on March 17th. We will work closely with liaisons at both schools to make sure the instruments get to those students in need.

Over the next month we will provide more information and outreach to give you an opportunity to learn about the importance of this effort.

The service committee will be collecting instruments at the 8:00 and 10:00 A.M. services March 10 and 17.

## The Closet 50th Anniversary in 2024

The Closet of the Greater Herndon Area, Inc is a non-profit thrift shop in Herndon incorporated in 1974. Prior to that, in the early 70s, churches in the Herndon area provided their own clothing collection to distribute to those in need. Two of the founding members of The Closet were Janice Shanks and Gwen Betor of St. Timothy's. In 1973 a letter was sent by these ladies to area churches about "forming an ecumenical thrift shop." History says that 11 churches came to the first meeting (there are now 20.)

Fifty years later, The Closet (845 Station Street) is a thriving business that still has the goals of

- 1. Giving people the opportunity to buy used clothing and household items at a nominal price.
- 2. Donating clothing without charge to needy persons after being referred by an authorized agency (currently, The Closet has a voucher system for this.)
- 3. Utilizing the profits for worthy projects that will benefit needy people. (Information provided by Trinity Presbyterian Church.)

Today, to donate to The Closet, items can be dropped off between 8:00 a.m. and 12:00 noon Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday. Donations are not accepted on Thursday or Sunday (The Closet is closed on Sundays.)

Shopping hours at Monday- Saturday from 10:00-5:00 with Monday and Thursday night hours until 8:00 p.m.

Volunteers are needed to assist the staff. Volunteers from the supporting churches as well as community members serve daily from 10-5 and during the evening hours on Monday and Thursday. High School students are welcome to volunteer to meet their school volunteer goals.
