## A Reading from Acts 3:12-19

Peter addressed the people, "You Israelites, why do you wonder at this, or why do you stare at us, as though by our own power or piety we had made him walk? The God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, the God of our ancestors has glorified his servant Jesus, whom you handed over and rejected in the presence of Pilate, though he had decided to release him. But you rejected the Holy and Righteous One and asked to have a murderer given to you, and you killed the Author of life, whom God raised from the dead. To this we are witnesses. And by faith in his name, his name itself has made this man strong, whom you see and know; and the faith that is through Jesus has given him this perfect health in the presence of all of you. "And now, friends, I know that you acted in ignorance, as did also your rulers. In this way God fulfilled what he had foretold through all the prophets, that his Messiah would suffer. Repent therefore, and turn to God so that your sins may be wiped out."



# LINK SPRING FOOD DRIVE - Starts Today!

The Service Ministry is hosting a Spring food drive for LINK. St. Timothy's is a member of LINK and has been helping our neighbors in need for over 40 years. LINK delivers food and other supplies to over 200 families each month in the Herndon and Sterling areas. The demand is higher than ever, and LINK needs our support!

For the next two weekends, members of the Service Ministry will be in the Narthex after each service to hand out cloth bags for you to fill with items for LINK. Attached to the bag will be a list of items that are in high demand. We will collect the bags the weekends of (April 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> and April 27<sup>th</sup> and 28th) at the close of each service. Currently the pantry is experiencing a shortage of macaroni and cheese, jelly and jam, diapers six 6, baby wipes and personal items such as shampoo, soap, laundry pods and dishwasher pods.

You may also pick up a bag at the Church office and drop off the food during the week. Items can be dropped off at the LINK basket in the hallway between the office and the Narthex. We are grateful for anything you can contribute to help with hunger in our community.
