

Dear St. Timothy's Family,

In the service for the Ordination of a Priest in our *Book of Common Prayer*, the portion of the service entitled "The Examination" begins with this paragraph:

My *brother*, the Church is the family of God, the body of Christ, and the temple of the Holy Spirit. All baptized people are called to make Christ known as Savior and Lord, and to share in the renewing of his world. Now you are called to work as pastor, priest, and teacher, together with your bishop and fellow presbyters, and to take your share in the councils of the Church.¹



I have highlighted the final statement and will focus on what those words mean below. Notice, however, the second sentence which, in the context of a <u>priest</u> being ordained, reminds those present that "All baptized people are called...." to do the work of the Church. Previous versions of the Prayer Book had stressed that the laity (that's you!) was instead more of a passive and helpless body that needed to be acted upon by those who were ordained. The 1979 Prayer Book strove to reimagine the different orders of the church towards a renewed understanding of the "priesthood of all believers."

That having been said, it is my great joy and responsibility as priest to be involved in the "councils of the Church." Since 2020, I have served as a member of the Committee for Constitution and Canons for the Diocese of Virginia. This has entailed (at the 226th, 227th, 228th, and 229th Diocesan Conventions) considering proposed amendments to the governing documents of the Diocese.² The work of this Committee is important (although frankly a little dry!) and I look forward to serving again at future conventions.

Given my background at Shrine Mont, our Diocesan Camps and Conference Center in the Shenandoah Valley, I have also been asked to serve on a number of committees related to that institution. For example, just as I started at St. Timothy's in the Spring of 2022, I served on an *ad Hoc* Committee leading Shrine Mont out of COVID and during a leadership transition.

In addition, just this last month, I was asked to serve on the Search Committee for the next Director of Shrine Mont Camps. I was honored to be asked and agreed to serve, even as I recognize that it will be another draw on my limited time. I ask for your prayers as the Committee goes about its work, looking for the leader to guide that special "place apart" into its next century of ministry.

It is a great gift to be a member of the Diocese of Virginia and of the (inter)national Episcopal Church. Mario+ and myself take those parts of our ministry seriously as have many in our congregation who have served at the Diocesan level and beyond in the "councils of the Church." In fact, the national church just put out a call to serve on the interim bodies between the triennial General Conventions. - The Service Ministry goal is to collect 50 backpacks.
