The Lessons

And we most humbly beseech thee, O merciful Father, to hear us, and, with thy Word and Holy Spirit, to bless and sanctify these gifts of bread and wine, that they may be unto us the Body and Blood of thy dearly beloved Son Jesus Christ.

And we earnestly desire thy fatherly goodness to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, whereby we offer and present unto thee, O Lord, our selves, our souls and bodies. Grant, we beseech thee, that all who partake of this Holy Communion may worthily receive the most precious Body and Blood of thy Son Jesus Christ, and be filled with thy grace and heavenly benediction; and also that we and all thy whole Church may be made one body with him, that he may dwell in us, and we in him; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord;

By whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Ghost all honor and glory be unto thee, O Father Almighty, world without end. **AMEN**.

Subject: KNEELER PROJECT

Notes taken during a meeting on June 22 at St. Timothy's to discuss the forthcoming visit of William Lauterbach from Indianapolis representing Devine Designs.

Attendees: Jackie and Charlie Clattenburg, Ruth Ellen Coffey, Sally Cowan and Mary Carol Madej.

The basic discussion was about quantity and themes for our kneeler project.

<u>How many</u> - There is the possibility to make 12 kneelers 11 in. by 32 in. or 24 kneelers 11 in. by 16 in. These dimensions are approximate. My initial discussions with Mr. Lauterbach indicated that he thought we would have a better chance to complete the smaller pieces in a timely manner and also the individual cost would be less.

Themes - So far we have three:

- 1. The 12 apostles' shields or symbols and 12 symbolic flowers or images.
- 2. 12 kneelers to include the 4 evangelists, Peter, Paul, Timothy (no rocks or clubs), All Saints, John the Baptist, Trinity, 2 more unspecified and 12 intermediate kneelers of selected symbols such as love, charity, faith, etc.
- 3. The history of St. Timothy's told by pictures of persons, events and places. This would require research and gathering of photos for the artists to use.
