

Dear St. Timothy's Family,

Last month, I had the great pleasure of visiting the National Gallery in Washington D.C. and the exhibit entitled: "Spirit & Strength: Modern Art from Haiti." On display through March 9, 2025 in the East Building,

(Mezzanine — Gallery 214), the exhibit features celebrated Haitian artists of the 20th century along with artists building upon their legacy today.¹

Within the exhibit, there are religious depictions, Haitian music, and an interactive section for children. For someone like myself who has never been to Haiti, it's one of the closest ways that I will come in the near future to experiencing the country and culture up close.

Another way, of course, is our upcoming Haiti Agape to be held here at St. Timothy's on the first three weekends of February. Our fundraising campaign for our school in Chapoteau, St. Mathieu's, is happening a bit out of the normal schedule but I hope that you will join with me and my family in making a generous contribution to our school partners in Haiti.

We have a wonderful lineup of events planned for the Agape 2025. On February 2nd, the Reverend Canon Serena Beeks will join us

via a video message to answer: **Why is the Episcopal Church in Haiti?** Over the past 20 years, Serena+, the U.S. Coordinator for Haiti Episcopal School Partnerships, has traveled to Haiti, sometimes several times a year, whenever political conditions allowed, to further the connections between our church and Haiti's schools.

On February 9th, our own Aceline Hyppolite, parishioner at St. Tim's and native of Haiti, will give a "pulpit pitch" on **Why is education so important in Haiti?** Aceline and her family live in Reston and came to St. Timothy's last year in part because of our relationship to Haiti. Her eldest child attends our Pre-school while the youngest was baptized here in May 2024.

Finally, on February 16th, Pére Gracia will provide a video message from the school in Haiti, reminding us

Blessings Bags

Last fall, the Community Engagement Team started looking at how we could help some of the unhoused people in our area.

St. Timothy's is no stranger to helping our neighbors in need. In fact, historically,

St. Timothy's hypothermia shelter, along with the efforts of other area churches, would help give birth to Reston Interfaith which became Cornerstones and the Embry Rucker Shelter.



Hypothermia. It's a real issue always – and especially at this time of vear.

Many of the unhoused in our area do not use the shelter, and many also prefer to maintain as much independence as they can. All year round, despite the weather, they spend a great deal of time outside.

We decided to create "Blessings Bags" to aid their wellbeing and their independence with items specifically researched and hoped to have the most potential benefit. We contacted people with experience with this community of folks to get ideas and to test the soundness of our own well-meaning ideas.

Agape for St. Mathieu's School in Chapoteau, Haiti

Over the next three weeks you will hear about the relationship between St. Timothy's and a small Episcopal school, St. Mathieu's, in the rural village of Chapoteau, Haiti. That relationship started in 2010, when we sent 15 children to school, and continues today, where we provide the sole financial support to a school of 250 children, ten teachers and four administrators. Our funds pay the salaries of the teachers who work in conditions that we would consider primitive, and they do it with professionalism, dedication, and joy. The building is of cinder block construction, has no electricity, running water, or plumbing. The teacher's walk to school wearing shirts and ties and the children in uniforms, often carrying their shoes to keep them clean. It is a beautiful sight.
